Scripture reading: Leviticus 25

Table questions:

- 1. Based on what you heard from Dave's reading of the text, what is Jubilee?
- 2. And what was the purpose of it? Why did God declare it?
- 3. We have no evidence that this Jubilee ever happened. Can you think of some reasons why that might be?
- 4. In the gospels, Jesus begins his ministry by declaring a kind of jubilee—do you remember what he said?
- 5. Is it possible for us to do jubilee now? And if we can't, are there ways we can practice parts of it, as a way that all can feel free–spiritually and economically?

Stations

Prison care kits—In the senior high youth room, you can put together MORE prison care kits. This is keeping with the scripture where Jesus declares jubilee at the beginning of his ministry—part of that meant a release of captives. As you put the kits together, think about this as an opportunity to create a moment of jubilee for prisoners, most of whom do not get to experience mercy in their prison sentence. And if you have time, write a note of love and support and include it in a prison care kit.

Jubilee banner—On the Jubilee banner, found in the room behind the fireplace, color in a letter, include your name on the banner and/or write how you want to make this a year of jubilee.

Word jumble—Word jumbles are found on the tables. If you need a quiet, introverted activity, this is for you!

Signs of Life scavenger hunt—Take a walk outside, and look for those signs of life that had nothing to do with our own striving. How is God providing jubilee in creation? Take some time to also write some of your thoughts down on the bulletin board.

Jubilee game—At the table in the Sunday school hallway, play a game of Jubilee, and feel what it feels like to have your debts paid off. Talk with each other about fairness vs. jubilee.
